Must include written speech, supporting materials (such as photos, news articles, letters, awards or other pieces of information that support speech given), and a reference list of sources used. Video of Speech (include a one-page document to display which includes title of speech, name, county, age division and 5 x 7 picture of member presenting speech in addition to jump drive)
Digital Story Telling	Digital Story with a 4-H or non-4-H Theme (include a one-page document to display which includes title of digital story, name, county, age division and 5 x 7 picture of a slide, screenshot, link, QR code, etc. of your story in addition to jump drive)
New Mexico Round-Up	Craft of Your Choice using a recycled boot (Boot must be deconstructed or altered from original state.)
Crochet, Weaving, Duded Up Denim, Jewelry Mak- ing, Origami	Other item not in project book – Must include Project Information Sheet
Macrame	Unit 1, 2, 3 – articles need completed Project Information Sheet
Knitting	Unit I - Two small articles, using the basic knitting stitches – knit and purl (head band, cap, slippers, belt, purse, placemats, pillow top, scarf, muffler, or other items.  Unit II – Two Articles (shrink, vest, simple sweater, poncho, shawl, cap and/or mittens) showing: a. Increasing and decreasing stitches. b. Two or more connected pieces. c. Use of two or more colors (as in stripes). d. A combination of at least two variations of basic knit and purl stitches in each article.  Unit III - Garment or large article such as an afghan, coat, sweater, dress, suit or other item, using a pattern that includes a design variation in stitch pattern and/or color.  Unit III - Mittens, socks or hat knitted using four needles.
Photography	Panorama - 3 individual 4x6 photos, or a 6"x18" print must be mounted no larger than 8"x22", with a caption.  Unit 2 - Panorama Photo - a single image comprised of at least 3 individual images, placed end-to-end. OR a single image taken using the Panorama setting in-camera.  Unit 3 - Color photo converted to black and white - original and black and white photo must be mounted on the same display

Cake Decorating	All entries must be real cakes (no forms or foam) and will be cut and tasted for judging. Cake recipes utilizing alcohol are ineligible. Royal icing or Fondant cannot be used as a base frosting in units 1-3. Recommendation: Take a picture of your final decorated cake and provide it to your agent to have available to show judges in case of mishaps and/or heat effects during transportation.

#### Sale Ring Pie and Cake:

#### **ENTRIES DUE JULY 7**

#### 1st CAKE/PIE DROP OFF- FRIDAY, JULY 19th, YOUTH HALL

- Open to Novice, Junior, and Senior Members
- C-1x Whole cake made from scratch that does not require refrigeration.
- C-2x Whole pie made from scratch that does not require refrigeration.

#### The following food safety guidelines must be followed:

- Frostings or fillings must be at least 65% sugar by weight to be considered food safe at room temperature. (See example)
- 2. No raw eggs or raw flour in uncooked frostings or fillings. Commercial meringue powder may be used in place of raw egg whites for frosting.
- 3. No cream cheese frosting or filling (unless calculation is provided proving the recipe is at least 65% sugar).
- 4. No chocolate ganache, heavy cream frosting, or lemon curd.
- 5. No fresh fruit or vegetables as garnishes.
- 6. No custard pie (ex. pumpkin pie), cream pie, or chiffon pie.
- 7. No fresh (unbaked) fruit pie/cake (ex: fresh strawberry pie).
- 8. Fruit may be cooked into a product (ex. pineapple upside down cake).
- 9. No dairy-based filling (ex. sour cream, cream cheese, ricotta).
- 10. Dairy products baked into the entire batter (not as a separate filling) are allowed.
- 11. No alcohol may be used in preparation.
- 12. Food containers will not be returned.

#### Members eligible to bake a cake/pie for sale through Market Sale must:

- 1. Bake cake/pie of choice and enter one whole cake/pie and report portfolio.
- 2. The following items must be entered in a report portfolio.
  - A cover page including photo of the cake/pie, exhibitor's name, name of recipe and county.
  - b. The recipe & sugar calculation if applicable
- 3. 4-H Story
  - a. Not to exceed 2 double spaced pages
  - b. Margins are to be no smaller than 1 inch.
  - c. Font size of at least 12 for readability
  - d. White paper with blue or black ink
  - e. Details to include in the story:

- i. Goals for foods project taken.
- ii. How pie/cake recipe was chosen
- iii. Description of past involvement in 4-H foods projects and activities
- iv. How foods knowledge learned in 4-H will be used in the future
- v. Any other information exhibitor would like to share with the judges.
- vi. This is a professional report, not a scrapbook. Do not add additional photos.
- 4. Winning recipes cannot be repeated in 4-H competition for five years. The previous year's winner cannot enter the same category for one year following.

    - i. Maddie Coburn Vegan Chocolate Cake
    - ii. Andromeda Vandermolen Dutch Apple Pie
  - b. 2020 no cake/pie auction held
  - c. 2021
    - i. Evinn Pedroncelli Pumpkin Cake with Cream Cheese Frosting
    - ii. Lauren Sesnie Double Crust Apple Pie
  - d. 2022
    - i. Eva Balthrop-Turtle Chocolate Layer Cake
    - ii. Addie Gillingham -Razzelberry Pie (raspberries, blueberries, & blackberries)
  - e. 2023
    - i. Avery Lovato Apple Pecan Cake with Cream Cheese Frosting
    - ii. Sylus Roy Homestead Berry Pie (black currant and raspberry)
- 5. The winner must be prepared to provide a second cake/pie for the actual sale. The 4-Her is responsible for finding their own bidders for the auction. If the Market Sale is divided into 2 separate sales, the Sale Ring Cake will sell in the Livestock Sale and the Sale Ring Pie will sell in the Small Animal Sale.
- 6. The agent responsible for Youth Hall must be notified of Sale Ring Cake/Pie withdrawal prior to 3:00pm the day before the sale.
- 7. If a 4-Her has two eligible animals in the sale, only two entries can be sold (i.e. 1 cake and 1 animal or 2 animals). If the winner declines to sell the cake/pie, the second place Sale Ring cake/pie winner will be eligible for the sale.
- 8. The entries will be judged 70% on the food taste & appearance, 30% on the story.

If an entrant has a question about the suitability, food safety, or repetition of the planned recipe, the Youth Hall 4-H agent and/or Youth Hall Superintendent(s) should be contacted prior to Youth Hall judging day. Any amendments to these rules will be published in the county 4-H newsletter prior to the county fair.

Example 1: Simple Buttercream Frosting

Ingredients (weight in grams) 2 cups unsalted butter (454g)

8 cups powdered sugar (960g)

½ teaspoon salt (3g) ¼ cup heavy cream (59g) 2 teaspoons vanilla extract (8g) Total Weight 1430g % sugar: (960/1430) x 100 = 67.1 %

This frosting is more than 65% sugar and considered stable at room temperature.
