GARDENING CORNER

What to Grow in Winter

- Cold-Hardy Vegetables: Certain vegetables thrive in cooler temperatures and can be planted in late fall or early winter.
 Some excellent choices include:
- Kale: This leafy green becomes sweeter after frost.
- Brussels Sprouts: They can be harvested throughout the winter.
- **Broccoli**: A great option for winter harvests.
- Carrots: They can be left in the ground and harvested as needed

Violas: These flowers bloom even in freezing temperatures.

Crocuses: These bulbs can bloom through the snow, providing early spring color.

Gardening Techniques

Indoor Gardening: If outdoor gardening is challenging due to harsh weather, consider growing herbs and small vegetables indoors. Use windowsills or grow lights to provide adequate light for your plants.

<u>Greenhouses and Cold Frames</u>: These structures can protect your plants <u>from extreme cold and allow you to extend your growing season.</u> They create a microclimate that can support a variety of plants during winter.

Are you interested in becoming a COUNTY or HORSE COUNCIL MEMBER?

What is a County Council Member you ask? Well, County Council is the group of 4-H members who help run your county wide 4-H program and vote to make decisions on behalf of our county's 4-H program. They decide what fundraisers to have, how money gets spent, and how we can help the Fair board with the County Fair . Horse Council is a part of the horse program that works on helping further opportunities for equestrian based activities. There are many positions available and, because this is a YOUTH run council, County Council members will be expected to meet and make decisions as a group without parents involved in the meetings. There will be two Agents on the board as well as an Adult Treasurer (this is the parent who signs the checks after the youth decide what to spend). The Adult Treasurer will only be able to join virtually on "Zoom" and will be asked to leave once the checking account information has been given.

Positions are voted on by your fellow 4-H members and will only be done in person.

Positions available and what they are asked to do:

President: Work with your 4-H club officer team and 4-H organizational leaders to establish yearly club goals, monthly meeting agendas and programs, and develop club activity calendar. Guide each meeting and encourage 4-H member participation. Lead the team of officers in identifying annual goals, activities and events. Appoint members to participate on club programs and committees. Become familiar with parliamentary procedure. Plan your monthly meetings. Be prepared and organized.

Vice President: Work with your 4-H club officer team and 4-H organizational leaders to establish yearly club goals, monthly meeting agendas and programs, and develop club activity calendar. Develop and carry out a club's program year, calendar and provide leadership and direction for the club's educational programs. Arrange club meeting programs and chair the program portion of club meetings. Distribute the annual program/calendar to all club members and their families. Learn the duties of the President and preside at meetings when the President is absent. Follow-up with any committees who have not reported to the club. Contact program guests and speakers immediately after plans for a program have been made. Assist the presenters at your 4-H club meetings.

Secretary: Work with your 4-H club officer team and 4-H organizational leaders to establish yearly club goals, monthly meeting agendas and programs, and develop club activity calendar. Record the happenings (take minutes) of each meeting. Set-up and

maintain a secretary's binder for the program year. This binder should contain: annual goals, program plans, club roster, attendance, meeting minutes, committee reports and

correspondence. Read aloud minutes of the previous meetings to the club. Send correspondence to special guests who assist or visit your 4-H club. Maintain a Club Roster and Attendance List. Keep a record of attendance at each meeting.

Treasurer: Work with your 4-H club officer team and 4-H organizational leaders to establish yearly club goals, monthly meeting agendas and programs, and develop club activity calendar. Meet with club officers and leaders to develop a club budget for the year. Keep accurate, up to date records (of? i.e. financial transactions). Present a treasurer's report at each club meeting. Promptly pay all bills authorized for payment by the club budget or by club members. Maintain financial records including copies of all invoices, bills and cash receipts relating to the funds and property of the club. Check the monthly bank statements for 4-H accounts and keep an accurate ledger.

Optional:

Parliamentarian: Work with your 4-H club officer team and 4-H organizational leaders to establish yearly club goals, monthly meeting agendas and programs, and develop club activity calendar. Keep order at the club meetings. Assist in training the other officers in their duties and in parliamentary procedure. Make parliamentary rulings during the business portion of the meetings. Become familiar with the majority of motions that might be used in 4-H meetings. Become familiar with the following actions that may take place in a 4-H business meeting: Motions, Nominations, Amending a Motion and Committee Reports

Reporter: Work with your 4-H club officer team and 4-H organizational leaders to establish yearly club goals, monthly meeting agendas and programs, and develop club activity calendar. Report and tell your 4-H club, community and county about 4-H club events. Promote 4-H and encourage new members to join. Photograph 4-H meetings, events and programs. Write and submit news releases about 4-H activities and events to media. Keep a scrapbook of all articles submitted and published articles, if you do not have a 4-H Historian. Send reports and photographs to the County 4-H Agent for the County 4-H Newsletter.

Historian: Work with your 4-H club officer team and 4-H organizational leaders to establish yearly club goals, monthly meeting agendas and programs, and develop club activity calendar. Keep a scrapbook of all articles submitted, as well as published articles. Keep a record of the 4-H club's past. Collect and record the present to preserve it for the future. Publish monthly or quarterly club newsletters to report about member accomplishments. Ask members to write stories for the newsletter about events, projects and community activities. Provide a column in the newsletter for the leader's thoughts, Photograph the 4-H members at various 4-H events. Send reports and photographs to the County 4-H Agent for the County 4-H Newsletter

Historian: Work with your 4-H club officer team and 4-H organizational leaders to establish yearly club goals, monthly meeting agendas and programs, and develop club activity calendar. Keep a scrapbook of all articles submitted, as well as published articles. Keep arecord of the 4-H club's past. Collect and record the present to preserve it for the future. Publish monthly or quarterly club newsletters to report about member accomplishments. Ask members to write stories for the newsletter about events, projects and community activities. Provide a column in the newsletter for the leader's thoughts, Photograph the 4-H members at various 4-H events. Send reports and photographs to the County 4-H Agent for the County 4-H Newsletter

Song & Rec Leader: Work with your 4-H club officer team and 4-H organizational leaders to establish yearly club goals, monthly meeting agendas and programs, and develop club activity calendar. Organize and create activities for your 4-H club to participate in either before the business or program portions of your 4-H meetings. Help 4-H members feel welcome and meet each other. Create a fun and enthusiastic atmosphere for your 4-H meetings and events.

Council Delegate: Represent your 4-H Club at County 4-H Council Meetings. Report your club events to your 4-H Council Meetings. Report Council Events at your 4-H Club Meetings. Participate in County 4-H Council Events and Activities.

So, how do you run for office? Well, you will need to write a speech and then someone else will need to nominate you for the position.

Melissa Campos will need a written statement of intent to run by OCT. 27th 2025 for County Council and Phillip Alden will need the same for Horse Council.

Elections will take place the following week on Nov. 6th during the regularly scheduled County Council Meeting.

Council meetings happen once a month and it will be mandatory to attend in person meetings 75% of the time, while "Zoom" exceptions made on a limited basis. This is a full-time commitment to your county and your fellow 4-H members and should be treated as such. Remember, this is a YOUTH run program and we need your time and dedication to make it a fun and eventful year!
