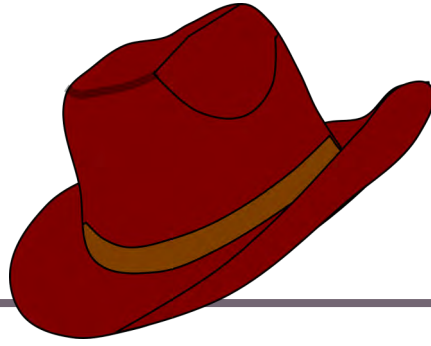

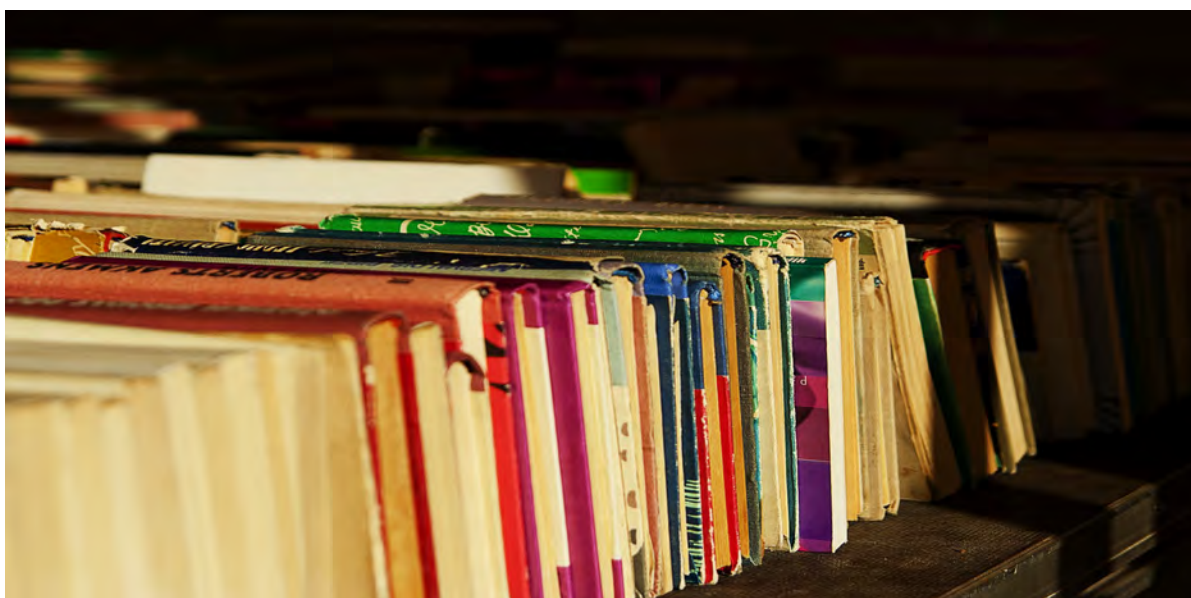

Club Spotlight

Los Ranchos 4-H Club and Pajarito Volando 4-H Club gathered in the month of February to show our furry friends some love! We met for some pizza and a community service project. Club members of all ages gathered up scissors, fleece, Poly-fill stuffing and old shirts. Working together we cut, tied, stitched and pieced together beds and blankets to donate to our local animal shelters.

In the true spirit of "Learn by Doing" we tested out several methods of making animal beds and blankets. First, we used the tried and true method of cutting fringe on fleece fabric and knotting it together. Much of the fleece fabric would have been too small for a human blanket but was just right for animal blankets. Second, we upcycled old club t-shirts into animal beds. We experimented with using stitch witchery to bind the seams together but ultimately decided using a sewing machine was the more durable method. The t-shirts were then stuffed with stuffing to make a soft, cushy bed. Skills practiced included measuring and cutting fabric using a rotary cutter and scissors, knotting, safety using an iron, and use of sewing machines.

We love our furry friends at 4-H and hope this project will help an animal in need to sleep a bit warmer until they are able to find their forever home. A big thanks to Jody Peach for donating her time and her home to help make this project a success.

This project is about waterfowl management including types of waterfowl, migration, habitat, and improvement.

Exhibit idea for county fair:

Make a poster displaying types of waterfowl that migrate through New Mexico and identify their migration routes on a map.

Project Highlight: Adventures with Food

The beginning level “Adventures with Food” is a one-time experience for members 9-11 years old and older youth having no experience with cooking.

Exhibit ideas for county fair:

3 cookies using the recipes in the book (oatmeal, peanut butter, or butterscotch fingers)



Project Highlight: Braiding Self-Determined

In this project, you will expand upon the basic principles of braiding. The self-determined project designation allows you to exhibit your braided item of choice. Make sure to include the Self-Determined form.

8 plait belt made from nylon cord



Contest Highlight: Fashion Revue

Clothing construction projects can be entered in the fashion revue competition at County Contest. There is no fashion revue at county fair. Winners are eligible to move on to the fashion revue at state conference (seniors) or district contest (novices & juniors). Cloverbuds can participate by modeling an outfit made by someone else.




